A. PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Induction Training of State Forest Service (SFS) Officers and Forest Range Officers (FROs): Directorate of Forest Education conducts Induction Training of newly recruited State Forest Service Officers and Forest Range Officers through three Academies under direct administrative and technical control of the Directorate and Induction training of FROs is also done in State run Academies under Technical control of DFE. The details of Courses during last three years are given as under:

- 2. In-Service Training / Workshops of State Forest Service Officers and Forest Range Officers: The DFE through the Central Academies organizes short term In-Service Training-cum-Workshops and for State Forest Service Officers on the following themes:

 - Biodiversity Conservation and Sustainable Livelihood
 - Community Forestry and Joint Forest Management
 - Human Resource Management
 - Legal Issues in Forestry
 - Training of Trainers
 - Ecosystem Approach to Forest Management
 - General Refresher Course
 - Forestry Related Central Legislation For J&K (CASFOS, Dehradun)

3. Refresher Courses for Frontline Staff of State Forest Departments: The Directorate of Forest Education facilitates conduct of refresher courses for Forest Frontline Staff (Deputy Rangers / Foresters / Forest Guards) in different State run Forest Academies and Forest Training Institutes by providing funds to organize short-term training courses of one week duration each for a group of 25-30 participants of the concerned State Forest Department where the course is organized. In the past, this Directorate has got such courses organized in almost every state of the country; and, there has been a wide spread appreciation for these courses. Details of such courses are given below:
