## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Burnihat under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted two days (22.12.2021 and 23.12.2021) for Personnel of Other training programme Services (Police/CRPF/BSF/SSB/CISF/ITBP) on the theme "Wildlife Trade and Trafficking". The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India sponsored for the 'Training of other stakeholders' and 'Personnelof Other services' on topics/themes related to Forestry, Wildlife, Environment Management, Administration and related issues. In this backdrop, training on the theme of "Wildlife Trade and Trafficking" was planned and organised. The training was conducted on virtual mode due to the current pandemic COVID-19 situation. 108 participants from 04 organisation of paramilitary forces and police across India participated with overwhelming enthusiasm in this training programme; which was first of its kind organized by CASFOS, Burnihat.

The training was inaugurated on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2021 with Dr.C. Ramesh IFS, Principal, CASFOS welcoming the chief guest Mr. H. V. Girisha, IFS Joint Director, Bureau Headquarter, Wildlife Crime Control Bureau, New Delhi and all the participants of the training programme. He gave a brief presentation about the academy and the course. He also emphasized the role of personnel of other services in conservation of Natural Resources specifically Wildlife. The Chief Guest Mr. H. V. Girisha, IFS Joint Director, in his Inaugural address gave an overview of Wildlife trade and also highlighted the roles of various paramilitary forces in preventing wildlife crimes.

Guest Speakers like Dr. Bibhuti P Lahakar, Programme Secretary, Aaranyak, Guwahati, Mr. MI Verghese, IFS(Rtd.), Thrissur, Kerala, Dr. Bibhav Kumar Talukdar, Dr. S. P. Goyal, Ex- Nodal Officer, Forensic Cell, WII, Dehradun, deliberated on various topics and aspects of Wildlife Trade and Trafficking in this training programme. The topics covered in this training were Overview of Illegal Wildlife Trade; Why conserve wildlife and biodiversity?; Wildlife Conservation Laws in India; Challenges in Checking wildlife trade; Identification of wildlife article and trophies & Case studies of wildlife trade and their investigation. The detailed timetable showing session-wise topics and resourve persons is enclosed as Annexure-5.

A total of 119 Personnel from ITBP, SSB, CRPF, Police registered for the training out of which 108 participated in the training programme. The training programme was very well appreciated by the participants who also requested for more of such training programmes regularly, for updating the participants about the recent developments in Wildlife Trade and Trafficking. They also requested for Organisation level trainings of paramilitary personnel. The Participants also urged for collaboration of Forest Department and other Departments in the States for effective implementation at the ground level.

The copies of the presentations made by the experts in each session were provided in soft copy to each trainee through the Whatsapp group, email and Microsoft Team, from where they could also download the recordings of all the sessions.
