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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Dehradun under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted three days (from 14.12.2022 to 16.12.2022) training programme for "*Lawyers and Defense counsels*" on the theme "*Legal issues in Forests, Wildlife and Environment*". The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India sponsored for the 'Training of other stakeholders' and 'Personnel of other services' on topics/themes related to Forestry, Wildlife, Environment and related issues. In this backdrop, training of Lawyers and Defense Counsels on the theme of '*Legal Issues in Forest, Wildlife and Environment*' was planned and organised. The training was conducted in a physical mode.

The Course Director of the training, Pradeep Wahule, IFS, Lecturer, CASFOS gave a brief presentation about the course after which Chief Guest Mr. G.N.Sinha, IFS (Retd.), Professor, UPES presented the opening remarks. In his opening remarks, he warmly welcomed the participants of the training prgramme. He further stated the importance of collective stakeholder approach in environment conservation for which, this very step to conduct training for other stakeholders is taken up by the CASFOS. In his address he also sensitized the participants regarding the importance of protection of Environment. He further said that not only forest department but also other stakeholders in the society have equally important role in natural resource and environment conservation. He also highlighted and shared with examples, that judiciary has played proactive role in natural resource and environment conservation. He has also put forth various points to ponder upon on environment conservation and human development. He also said that there is a need to strike a balance between sustainable use of natural resources and humane attitude towards weaker sections for their development. He further emphasized that the participants-Lawyers/legal community has an important role in bringing up the same. Guest Speakers like Mr. Sanjeev Gaur, IFS, CGM, FDCM, Mr. Ritwick Dutta, Advocate, Legal Initiative for Forest and Environment, Mr. A.K Jha, IFS (Retd.), Mr. Ritesh Sarothiya, Dy. Director, WCCB, New Delhi, Mr. Sanjay Sood, IFS, APCCF & Member Secretary, PCB, HP and Dr. K. P. Raghuram, Technical Officer, NBA, Chennai, deliberated on various topics related to legal issues in Forest, Wildlife and Environment in this training programme. The topics covered in this training were Genesis and Insights of IFA-1927, Legal issues in Natural Resources Governance, Forest Rights Act 2006 & Tribal Livelihood, Insights of Wildlife Protection Act - 1972, Overview of Environmental Law: Evolution, Principal & Environmental Safeguards and Insights of Biodiversity Act - 2002. The detailed timetable showing session-wise topics and resource persons is enclosed as Annexure-V.

A total of 31 lawyers/Advocate from 5 States across India registered for the training out of which 30 lawyers/Advocates from 05 States successfully completed the training programme. The training programme was very well appreciated by the participants who also requested for more of such training programmes regularly, for keeping up the momentum of conservation of natural resources by effective legal backup. The reduction in the number of participants when compared to registered number was due to the court day for which the participants have suggested to conduct the training in the weekend.

Valedictory session was presided over by chief guest Shri Bharat Jyoti, IFS, Director, IGNFA, Dehradun during which an interactive session with the participants was also held. The participants expressed the need to conduct more such courses so that the delicate matters pertaining to Forest & Wildlife jurisprudence could be handled by Officers of the Judiciary. The participants gave overwhelming response to the course.

A compendium of articles, presentations related to the relevant topics covered during the course, apart from the copies of the presentations made by the experts in each session were provided in soft copy to each trainee as part of the training kit by the Academy.

Overall impact of the training was positive and the feedback and high rating from the participants corroborates the assessment of the organizers.












Overall Feedback of Resource Persons on all Parameters
