

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Burnihat under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted two days (10.03.2021 and 11.03.2021) training programme for Personnel of Other Services (Agriculture, Horticulture, Soil Conservation, Animal Husbandry & Police etc.) on the theme "Biodiversity Conservation". The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India sponsored for the 'Training of other stakeholders' and 'Personnel of Other services' on topics/themes related to Forestry, Wildlife, Environment Mangement, Administration and related issues. In this backdrop, training on the theme of 'Biodiversity Conservation' was planned and organised. The training was conducted on virtual mode due to the current pandemic COVID-19 situation. 125 participants from 06 States across India participated with overwhelming enthusiasm in this training programme; which was first of its kind organized by CASFoS, Burnihat.

The training was inaugurated on 10th March 2021 with Course Director of the training, Shri. C.A.Rahman IFS (Rtd), Contractual Associate Faculty, CASFOS welcoming the chief guest Shri. R.P.Singh IFS, Director, Directorate of Forest Education and all the participants of the training programme. He gave a brief presentation about the academy and course. Dr. C.Ramesh IFS, Prinicpal, CASFOS in his opening remarks emphasized the role of other personnel of other services in conservation of Biodiversity and expressed his belief that this training through sensitization of personnel of other services would achieve the goal of Biodiversity Conservation. The Chief Guest Shri R. P. Singh IFS, Director, Directorate of Forest Education, Dehradun, in his Inaugural address said that Biodiversity of the Country is very rich and we need to protect and conserve it for the well being of human kind. He also emphasized about three main objectives of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), which are: the conservation of biological diversity; the sustainable use of the components of biological diversity; and the fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of the utilization of Biological Resources.

Guest Speakers like Dr. A.K.Johari IFS (Rtd), Ex.PCCF & Former Member Secretary of Assam State Biodiversity Board; Shri. C. Achalender Reddy,IFS(Rtd) Ex.PCCF,Arunachal Pradesh and Former Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority; Dr. Sarala Khaling, Regional Director Eastern Himalaya -Northeast India of Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment (ATREE), Gangtok; Dr. Narayan Sharma, Assistant Professor, Cotton University & Member of Assam State Biodiversity Board; Shri. A.Udhayan IFS, APCCF, Tamil Nadu and Shri. S.S.Rasaily IFS, APCCF, Uttarakhand alongwith in-house faculties Dr.C.Ramesh IFS and Shri. C.A.Rahman IFS (Rtd) deliberated on various Biodiversity Conservation related topic in this training programme. The topics covered in this training were Importance of Biodiversity Conservation and role of community in Biodiversity Conservation, Access & Benefit Sharing of Biological Resources, Financial incentives to BMC, Role of PBR in Biodiversity Conservation, ABS payment through BD Act-2002 and Functioning of BMCs in ABS. The detailed time table showing session-wise topics and resource persons is enclosed as **Annexure-5**.

A total of 137 Personnel from 06 states registered for the training out of which 125 participated in the training programme. The training programme was very well appreciated by the participants who also requested for more of such training programmes regularly, for keeping up the momentum of Biodiversity conservation ideas. They also requested for State & department level trainings of personnel of other services. The Participants also urged for collaboration of Forest Department and other Departments in the States for eccective implementation of Biodiversity Conservation at the ground level.

The copies of the presentations made by the experts in each session were provided in soft copy to each trainee as part of the training kit through the Whatsapp group, email and Microsoft Team, from where they could also download the recordings of all the sessions. The content of the course and reading material were found to be relevant and the participants highly appreciated by rating with 88.35% and 87.50%, respectively.

PARAMETER WISE FEEDBACK OF RESOURCE PERSONS







10th to 11th March, 2021



The diversity of life forms on this earth is a manifestation of 3.5 billion years of evolution. Biodiversity is at the centre of many economic activities, particularly those related to agriculture, animal husbandry, forestry, and fisheries. Globally, nearly half of the human population is directly dependent on natural resources for its livelihood, and many of the most vulnerable people depend directly on biodiversity to fulfil their daily subsistence needs. The Communities utilising the natural resources deal with the dual role of protection and conservation of biodiversity and making this conservation effort effective in securing sustainable livelihoods.

To effectively address these issues, an online two-days training on **'Biodiversity**

Conservation' for Personnel of Other Services (Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry & Police) is envisaged from 10th to 11th March, 2021. The course is designed to bring in leading experts and practitioners from the forest department, institutions and the field, to share their professional expertise.

Aim

- To understand and appreciate the indispensability of people's participation in biodiversity conservation;
- To familiarize themselves with the latest developments in the field of Biodiversity Conservation for Sustainable Livelihoods;
- To understand the integration of livelihood issues in designing biodiversity conservation strategies;



Participants

The course is designed for Personnel of Other Services (Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry & Police) of North Eastern States of India. Non-registered participants are also allowed to participate through the link provided.

Registration

The registration of participants will start from **10th January 2021**. The Participants will need to register themselves on Microsoft teams portal and the link is **https://rb.gy/l2g0qu**



Duration

The course will be of 2 days duration commencing at 9.30 am on 10^{th} March,

2021. There will be four sessions of about 90 minutes each. To break the monotony of classes, there will also be Desktop Yoga: simple, relaxing workout which participants can perform while sitting at their desks which will help them to calm, invigorate and relax.

Mode of Delivery

The sessions will be held online through a web portal with audio-visual aids. The participants will need to make themselves available at a place with a computer/ laptop/ smartphones and good internet connectivity. Video conferencing facilities including microphones and cameras should be available with the gadget.

Topics to be Covered

The program will cover topics related to Biodiversity Conservation. Some of the key topics to be covered will be:


- a) Importance and need of Biodiversity conservation
