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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As a part of the scheme of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India, New Delhi, to train 'Other Stake Holders' outside the domain of the Forest Department which include the NGO's, Media Personnel, Lawyers and Defense Counsels, Lecturers and Professors of Science Colleges, Educators and Teachers-in-charge of Eco clubs etc, the Central Academy for State Forest Service, Burnihat is mandated to conduct a two-day training programme on "Sensitization on Natural Resource Conservation" for Press and Media personnels.

This theme-based training programme was held from 17th to 18th August, 2021 for media personnels from national and regional print and electronic media, journalists, editors, radio news readers, reporters and radio and video anchors.

A total of sixty-eight (68) registrations were received from seventeen (17) States of which forty-Six (46) media personnels attended the said training programme and were awarded with the Course Completion Certificates. The rest of the participants did register but did not attend the training programme partially or completely.

The "Sensitization on Natural Resource Conservation" module was developed with the experts' input on the subject and feedback of earlier courses and in-house experience. The methodology followed was online training through Google meet platform, wherein the participants registered themselves online through a registration form. Thereafter, all the registered participants were given a link to join the training sessions.

The Course was inaugurated by the Chief Guest Mr. D. P. Bankwal IFS (Retd.), Former Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & CWLW, Assam. The Course Director of the training Shri C. A. Rahman IFS (Retd.), Contractual Associate Faculty, CASFOS welcomed the Chief Guest and Participants. He gave a brief presentation about aim and objective of the Course. Dr. C. Ramesh, Principal in his opening remarks emphasized the role of media in Conservation of Natural Resources by various programmes of their media houses, Reportings, article writtings and coverage of various efforts of Governments, civil society and other stakeholders in protection and

conservation of Natural Resources of the country and expressed his belief that this training through sensitization of press and media persons would achieve the goal. Mr. D. P. Bankwal IFS (Retd.) in his ingaural address told that the Media through their reporting, story telling or news items play an important role in bringing the correct picture of the issues related with Environment, Forest, Wildlife and other natural resources. He asked to strengthen the existing linkage between the Forest department and Media and Press personnels to make the Natural Resource protection and conservation efforts more effective and efficient.

The Resource persons like Mr. Praveen Bhargay, Managing Trustee of Wildlife First, Mr. Agni Mitra, IFS, Dy. Director, Wildlife Crime Control Bureau, Kolkata, Mr. N.I. Editor, Laskar, Consultant Eastern Chronicle. Guwahati. Ms. Sharada Balasubramanian, Independent Environmental and Development journalist, Ms. Madhu Sarin, Environmental Actvist, Mr. Ramesh Menon, Adjunct Professor, Symbiosis Institute of Media & Communication, Pune and Mr. Ishan Kukreti, Senior Journalist, Down to Earth deliberated on various aspects related with the theme of the training programme. The topics covered in this training were Forest & Wildlife Conservation: Issues & Challenges; Basic tenets of Forests & wildlife laws; Reporting from Forest & Wildlife Conflict scenes: Dos and Don'ts; Role of Media in promoting Environmental awareness; Media-Forest Cooperation; Civil Society and Green Activism; Environmental journalism-status and way ahead and Media coverage of forest and wildlife related issues

The copies of the presentations made by the experts in each session were shared in soft copy to participants through the Whatsapp group.





OVER ALL FEEDBACK OF RESOURCE PERSONS








