

# Central Academy for State Forest Service, Dehradun Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change Government of India

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#### **Executive Summary**

As a continuation of the series of special online courses on **Forestry Related Central Legislation** for State Forest Service Officers and Range Forest Officers exclusively for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, after the J&K Reorganization Act, 2019, the fourth training course was organized from 02<sup>nd</sup> to 07<sup>th</sup> November, 2020. Out of 66 nominations received, a total of 63 participants participated in this training programme. The group consisted of 09 Deputy Conservator of Forests, 15 Assistant Conservator of Forests and 42 Range Forest Officers.

The deliberations began with the inauguration of the course on 02<sup>nd</sup> November 2020 by Shri Jigmet Takpa, IFS, Joint Secretary, MoEF&CC wherein Sh. T. Rabi Kumar, IFS, CCF (Central) from Jammu & Kashmir was present as Guest of Honour. Shri Jigmet Takpa, IFS applauded the efforts of the Academy for calling the best resource persons and conducting online courses that have become a need of the hour, given the COVID-19 related restrictions and precautions in traveling and assembly. He also appreciated the J&K Forest Department for taking the initiative to train its officers in changed scenario. Shri Jigmet Takpa also urged the participants to take maximum benefit of this opportunity, where eminent people would join the training programme from distant places despite their very busy schedules.

Shri Rabi Kumar, IFS, CCF, Central J&K expressed his gratitude to the Academy for conducting the series of courses, that are highly appreciated by the participants. He hoped that this course would also be able to meet the expectations of the participants. He mentioned the need of generating UT specific case studies to make the training program more relevant to the officers. He stated the need to develop some Master Trainers from amongst the participants, who could further train the field staff of the Union Territory.

Shri Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Dehradun, appreciated & congratulated the efforts of the authorities of J&K in restructuring the Indian Forest Act, 1927 which he felt was progressive compared to other States. According to him, this course has been unique as it included a variety of experts like serving and retired senior forest officers, academicians, bureaucrats, and leading lawyers in the country and that this course has been planned well and is touching upon almost all the Acts related to Forestry and Wildlife.

The inaugural session was followed by a session on the Relevance of CrPC to Forest Officers by Shri Abhilash Damodaran, IFS, Lecturer CASFOS, Dehradun; Relevance of Indian Penal Code & Indian Evidence Act to Forest Officersby Dr. C. Ramesh, IFS, Lecturer, CASFOS, Dehradun; two sessions on Indian Forest Act, 1927 by Shri Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Principal, CASFOS Dehradun; Forest

(Conservation) Act, 1980 by Shri Sandeep Sharma, AIG, MoEF&CC; Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 by Shri R.S. Thakur, IPS, Himachal Pradesh; Wildlife Crime Scenario and Investigation Under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 by Shri Ritesh Sarothiya, Special Task Force MP Forest Department; Wetland Rules by Shri Ritesh Kumar, Director, Wetlands International South Asia, New Delhi; Judgements related to Forest & Environment by Shri Sanjay Upadhyay, Advocate, Supreme Court, New Delhi; National Green Tribunal Act, 2010: Court Orders by Shri Ritwick Dutta and Ms Kanika Sood, Advocates, New Delhi; Biological Diversity Act, 2002 by Shri Abhay Johari, IFS (Retd.), Guwahati; Forest Rights Act, 2006 by Ms. R. Jaya, IAS, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi; and FRA: Case Study by Shri A.K. Jha, IFS (Retd.) In this course two sessions were dedicated for Group Exercise & Presentation by the participants. The participants were divided into six groups for conducting group discussion among themselves through break-out feature of Microsoft Teams. The group discussions were mentored by Shri Rabi Kumar, IFS, CCF (Central) J&K, Shri Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, , Shri K. Ramesh, ifs, CCF Jammu and Shri Abhilash Damodaran, IFS, Lecturer, CASFOS, Dehradun. All the relevant reading material like bare Acts, Rules, and presentations etc. were provided to the participants about a week before commencing the training through Sharepoint, an online mode of sharing and accessing information. In addition, the hard copies of the bare Acts were sent to participants for reference purpose. In addition to these study materials, sample confiscation orders, samples of various forms and memo used in investigation and prosecution of forest and wildlife offences were also shared with the participants.

All the sessions were highly appreciated by the participants even though concern about shortage of time for each of the Act was also raised by few participants. This batch of attendees was particularly very interactive most of the time.

Some of the participants requested for more such thematic courses on issues like:

- Investigation techniques and procedures
- Prosecution procedures
- Special issues in JK UT such as hurdles in implementation of IFA, Forest (Conservation) Act etc.

The Valedictory Programme on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2020 was presided by the Chief Guest Smt. Uma Devi, IFS, Addl. Secretary, MoEF&CC, New Delhi and Guests of Honour Shri . T. Rabi Kumar, IFS CCF, J&K, Shri R.P. Singh, IFS, Director, Forest Education, Dehradun and Dr. Mohit Gera, IFS, PCCF (HoFF) J&K.. The Chief Guest and Guests of Honour congratulated the participants and the organizers for making this training course successful and applauded its design which suited the requirements of

the participants. Dr. Mohit Gera, IFS, further added that since the ACFs & RFOs are at the cutting-edge positions, it was very important to have a thorough knowledge of the law and its implementation in the field. He said he was looking forward to more such UT specific courses in the future. He expressed his happiness over the discussion on the Forest Rights Act, 2006 that the field officers are now going to implement the same in the UT and a thorough knowledge of the Act would be essential for all the field officers.

Shri Rabi Kumar remarked that with the advent of technology it is now possible to train the officers to the new legal regime in the field of forestry and wildlife. He congratulated the organizers that despite the connectivity challenge, the participants could be imparted the best possible training successfully. He reminded the participants that now being alma-mater of the Academy, they may contact the academy and the resource persons without any hesitation for any further information. He also expressed his desire for further such courses specially designed for identified Master Trainers from amongst the participants who could further train the frontline staff of the Union Territory. He appreciated the efforts of the organizers and the resource persons in making this programme successful. He also mentioned that UT of J&K would be looking forward to conducting more theme-based courses in collaboration with CASFOS, Dehradun

Shri Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Dehradun, profusely thanked all the organizers, resource persons, and the participants for making this training programme very successful and that the Academy would always be at the forefront in conducting such programmes on contemporary issues frequently in coming future.

The overall impact of the training has been very encouraging and positive. This is supported by the fact that the overall feedback score achieved for this training session was **95.18%** which is on the higher side and corroborates the efforts taken by the organizers of the Academy and all the resource persons to make this programme a success.
