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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Central Academy for Forest Education (CAFE), Kurseong under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted two days (15.07.21 and 16.07.21) training programme on **Forest Certification in the Indian Context** for "Training of Other Stake Holders" ie for NGOs. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India sponsors for the second year, the training of Other Stake Holders and training of Personnel of Other Services on topics/themes related to Forestry, Wildlife, Environment Management, and related issues. In this backdrop, training of NGO's on the theme "Forest Certification in the Indian Context"who are having role in Forest and Environment conservation was conducted. The training was conducted on virtual mode due to the current pandemic COVID-19 situation. More than 40 participants from different States of India registered with overwhelming enthusiasm in this training programme of which 28 attended the training programme.

The Course Director of the training, Dr. T. Beula Ezhil Mathi IFS, Principal In charge, CAFÉ kurseong gave opening remarks and a brief presentation about the course after which sessions of the course started.

Guest Speakers like Shri Abhilash Damodaran, IFS, CASFOS, Dehradun, Mr.Manmohan Yadav, Professor & Dean, Indian Institute of Forest Management, Bhopal, Mr. Raju Agasimani, Regional General Manager, CG State Forest Development Corporation, Raipur, Mr. Atul Jindal IFS, Additional managing Director, Forest Corporation of Uttar Pradesh, Ms.Sree Lakshmi IFS, DCF Vanbhavan Office of PCCF, Nagpur, Maharashtra, deliberated on various Forest Certification in the Indian Context related topics in this training programme.

The topics covered in this training were overview of Forest resources in India, Sustainable Forest Management - Criteria and indicators, Forest Certification in the Indian Context - Scope and challenges, Forest Certification processes and schemes, Forest Certification & Timber Industry, Forest Certification of Non-timber Forest produce. 
