## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Central Academy for State Forest Service, (CASFOS) Coimbatore under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change was identified to organize a three days physical mode training of Personnel of Other Services for State level Officers (Class II & III) working in Judiciary, Police and Revenue departments from TamilNaduand nearby Stateson the topic "Forest and Wildlife Laws" from 04<sup>th</sup> to 06<sup>th</sup> September, 2023.

In this background, a three days training program was planned to sensitize the personnel working in Revenue, Judiciary and Police departments about the forestry sector and the various Acts and Rules governing our forests. Accordingly, nominations for the training were requested from the above mentioned departments from States of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka and Puducherry. About 24 participants from Revenue and Police departments working at Division / Sub-Division levels from Tamil Nadu and Puducherry attended the training program.

The module for the training was developed with the expert's input on the subject and feedback received of earlier courses and in-house experience. The training was conducted through Class room lectures with Power Point Presentations, Case study discussion, Panel Discussion and Field Trip to Anamalai and Parambikulam Tiger Reserves.

The training began with inauguration on the first day with Shri. Ramasubramanian, IFS, CF & Field Director, Anamalai Tiger Reserve, Tamil Nadu as Chief Guest in the presence of Shri V. Thirunavukarasu, IFS, APCCF & Principal, CASFOS Coimbatore. The Course Director of the training, Dr.C. Vidhyasagar, IFS., Lecturer, CASFOS gave the welcome address. Shri. V. Thirunavukarasu, IFS., Principal, CASFOS, Coimbatore in his opening remarks, welcomed the Chief Guest Shri. Ramasubramaniyam, IFS., Conservator of Forests and Field Director, Anamalai Tiger Reserve and all the participants of the training programme. He gave a brief introduction about the forest and issues concerning the forest and environmental conservation. He emphasized the fact that every one of us working in State/Central Government have a fundamental responsibility to conserve this important natural resource. The Chief Guest of the occasion Shri. Ramasubramaniyan, IFS., Conservator of Forests and Field Director, Anamalai Tiger Reserve briefly highlighted the necessity of co-ordination between various departments in prevention and control of illegal activities happening in and out of our Forests. He expressed his belief that this training will enhance the capacity of other department personnel to understand the various Acts and rules governing our Forests which will strengthen the cause of conservation. The Course Co-ordinator, Dr. C. Vidhyasagar, IFS., Lecturer, CASFOS then gave a brief presentation about the structure of the course.

The topics covered in the training programme were "Overview of National Forest Policy and Forest legislations of the Country" by Shri V. Thirunavukkarasu, IFS., APCCF & Principal, CASFOS-Coimbatore, "CrPC, IPC, CPC & Evidence Act applicable to Forestry and Wildlife

Laws" by Shri. Chandrasekhar, DCF (Rtd), Course Co-ordinator, Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, "Forest Conservation Act 1980" by Shri. Sasi Kumar IFS, Dy. Inspector of General (C), Integrated Regional Office, MoEFCC, Chennai, "Introduction to Wildlife Protection Act" by Shri. Udhayan IFS, PCCF& Director, AIWC - Chennai, "50 yrs of Project Tiger" by Sh. N. S. Murali, IFS., IGF, NTCA, Bengaluru, "Overview of Illegal Wildlife Trade and role of Various regulatory agencies in control of Wildlife Crime" by Dr. M.Kirupashankar, IFS., Reg. Dy. Dir, Southern Region, WCCB, MoEFCC, Govt. of India, "Human-Wild life Conflict management: Case Study Discussion" by Dr. M. In the valedictory session participants gave their verbal feedback regarding the course. The course was highly appreciated by the participants. They expressed their opinion that such trainings should be held more frequently and also suggested that meetings of Officials from these departments working at Division / Sub-division levels be conducted periodically for necessary coordination in the field.


