

Preface

Forestry, in a holistic view, is an integration of various disciplines relying on scientific principles and traditional wisdom. Managing the forests not only includes management of trees and stands, but also other flora and fauna in varied ecosystems and human beings either living inside the forest ecosystem or on forest fringe areas.

The Directorate of Forest Education's primary mandate is to conduct induction and in-service training for SFS Officers/FROs and also to support in-service training for Forest Frontline Staff (Dy. Rangers / Foresters / Forest Guards). Thus, the Directorate plays a crucial role in keeping the forest management of our country up to date and modern through training management.

The Government of India through this Directorate supplements the efforts of State Governments for capacity building of the frontline forest staff (Deputy Rangers/ Foresters/ Forest Guards) by providing funds to organise short-term training courses of the concerned State Forest Department. This Directorate has got such courses organised in almost every state of the country and there has been wide spread appreciation of the same.

The Director's Report - 2018 of the DFE is a compilation of all the activities of the Directorate and its constituent Academies during the year 2017-2018.


The post of Director Forest Education was created in the year 1953 to assist the President, Forest Research Institute and Colleges and was responsible for professional and technical training/education in the country. Subsequent to re-organization of Forestry Research, Education and Training Institutions in 1987, the erstwhile Indian Forest College got upgraded to Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy. Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education was created as an autonomous body under the Ministry of

Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) to organize, direct and manage research in Forest Sector at National Level.

The Directorate of Forest Education was separated as an independent organization under the direct control of MoEF&CC for the training of State Forest Service officers and Forest Range Officers. The Directorate also supplements the efforts of the State Governments for the training of Frontline Forest Staff (Deputy Rangers, Foresters and Forest Guards).

The main mandate of the Directorate of Forest Education are:

- To cater to the training needs of the SFS Officers and RFOs of States/Union Territories in the country.
- To ensure 'Standard and Quality' of Training being imparted to the Forestry personnel other than Indian Forest Service.
- To augment training 'Capacity and Facility' for the frontline forest staff (Forest Guards, Foresters, Deputy Rangers and Range Officers).
- To assist in developing appropriate and relevant training contents and evaluation standards for forestry training at all levels below IFS.
- To help States assess training needs of forestry personnel.
- To assist in the development of training policy for forestry personnel.

Presently the Directorate directly controls three Central Academies for State Forest Service, at Dehradun (Uttarakhand), Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) and Burnihat (Assam) and one Central Academy of Forest Education (CAFE) at Kurseong (West Bengal).

The Directorate also exercises, technical control over all the State run Rangers Colleges in the country. All these Academies/ Colleges/ Institutes/Schools undertake the activities concerning induction and in-service training of SFS Officers and FROs and short term General Refresher Courses, Theme Based Courses of two week duration, One week workshop for in-service SFS Officers and FROs as per their respective mandate.

The Directorate of Forest Education is headed by the Director Forest Education; a senior officer from the Indian Forest Service. The Directorate has had illustrious members of the service heading it.

Research Institute and Colleges and creation of Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) as an autonomous organization, the Directorate of Forest Education was delinked from the Forest Research Institute and Colleges. It has since then functioned directly under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

To cater to the increasing demand of the State Forest Departments and Central forestry organization for trained Officers, three State Forest Service Colleges were established by the Central Government at Burhihat (Assam) in 1976, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) in 1980 and Dehradun (Uttarakhand) in 1981 for imparting training to the State Forest Service Officers of two years duration.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Burnihat

Established in the year 1976, CASFOS, Burnihat has the distinction of being the first State Forest Service College in the country. The Academy is spread in an area of about 23 hactares with offices and most infrastructure facilities located in the Assam side of campus, located 25 kms from Guwahati, the capital of Assam. Now rechristened the CASFOS, it is situated on the border of two States, Assam and Meghalaya, occupies both sides of National Highway 40, popularly known as GS Road. The

Academy had provided induction training to 500 ACF/SFS officers in 14 batches. The Academy started training for FROs from the year 2000 and since then 422 Range Officers in 16 batches have passed out from this Academy as on date. The Academy campus is spread over Kamrup District of Assam and Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Coimbatore

Established in 1980, CASFOS, Coimbatore is located in the picturesque Forest Campus at R.S. Puram in the city of Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu. The Academy is situated at a distance of 5 km from the Coimbatore Railway Station and 22 km from Coimbatore International Airport. The Academy shares the space of the exquisite Forest Campus alongwith two more premier forestry institutions *viz.*, Tamil Nadu Forest Academy (TNFA) and Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB) one of the

leading research institutes under Indian Council of Forest Research and Education. This campus also houses the famous 'Gass Museum'.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Dehradun

Established in 1981, the CASFOS, Dehradun is located in the beautiful New Forest Campus in Dehradun which is also the cradle of Forestry Education and Training in India. CASFOS has the privilege of having in its neighbourhood other premier institutions like Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy (IGNFA), Indian Council for Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Forest Research Institute (FRI), FRI University, Forest Survey

of India (FSI) and Wildlife Institute of India (WII) which enhance the learning environment for the Officer Trainees with increased opportunities for interaction with serving IFS officers, Probationers from IGNFA, Scientists and Researchers from ICFRE and FRI.

Central Academy of Forest Education (CAFE), Kurseong

Established in 1974, the CAFE is the only forest training institution under Government of India exclusively to train Forest Range Officers, the institute is located on picturesque St. Mary's Hill in Kurseong near Darjeeling, overlooking the mighty Kanchenjunga. The Forest Rangers training in India is over 100 years old. Rangers Training was imparted upto 1978 centrally through 5 colleges located at Dehradun, Coimbatore, Kurseong, Chandrapur and Balaghat. These colleges were managed by the Government of India and had a training program of 2 years. After 1987, the erstwhile Eastern Forest Rangers' College, Kurseong now called as Central Academy of Forest Education (CAFE) is the only Rangers college under the Government of India training Forest Range Officers.

Forestry Training Institute and Rangers College (FTI&RC), Sunder Nagar was established in September, 1994 for conducts Induction training of new recruits and inservice training of Forest Personnel. The Institute is currently conducting regular Induction Training Courses for Range Forest Officers and Forest Guards. Besides this the Institute also conducting refresher courses for the Front Line Staff and the Ministeiral staff of the HP Forest Department. Tailor made training courses for other Departments/ Projects/HPSFDC/Agencies/Community Members/Eco-torism/Nature guides are also conducted in this Institute. The Institute has successfully conducted Induction training for Range Forest Officers from all across the Country since 2012. So far, three batches have

passed out from the Institute. The Institute has also successfully conducted training for 28 batches of Forest Guards since its inception in 1994. FTI&RC, Sunder Nagar is situated at an altitude of 1000 meters above the mean sea level near Van Chetana Kendra DPF Trambari Karnody. It covers an area of 1.2 ha and is about 6 kms from Sunder Nagar bus stand on National Highway-21 (Chandigarh-Manali Highway).

Gujarat Forest Rangers College, Rajpipla, Gujarat

Gujarat Forest Rangers College has been established in February 1979 with an objective

of Training Range Forest Officers from different states. This college is in a campus known as Vadiya Palace presently in Rajpipla, Dist.- Narmada, Gujarat. The total area of the Vadiya palace is around 64.08 ha out which the GFRC occupies the area of 56.08 ha.

The first batch of Range Forest Officer trainees under went the basic training during 1979-81 with strength of 31 trainees and subsequent batches after that it continued upto 1998-2000 and till then total 485 Range Forest Officers took training in 15 different batches. The college has trained trainees from a total of 9 states and 1 UT. The alumni are spread over Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Jammu & Kashmir, T amil Nadu, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, U.T. of Diu & Daman and Dadra 7 Nagar Haveli.

The College also has imparted training to 341Vanpal Sahayak (Foresters Asst.) and 365 Vanraksha Sahayak (Guard Asst.) so far. The College also has conducted short and long term courses for Range Forest Officer, Forester, Beat guard, in form of Refresher Courses, and Frontline staff trainings. The College has also conducted training for surveyor, clerks and accountants of the Department. It also conducts trainings/workshops with NGO/JFMCS.

The College also has different facilities in form of Classrooms, Conference room, Library, Computer lab, Sports ground. The College is also having facility of Video Conferences, virtual class rooms and using these technique international experts interacted with trainees on various occasions.

Training will be in two phases covering total 18 subjects related to forestry, there will be about 5 tours of 145 days and trainees will be taken to local excursions in nearby forests.

Trainees will be given practical training also in Survey, Engineering, Resource Management, Remote Sensing, GIS etc. The total duration of the training is 18 months. Training in the field of Weapon, Motor Mechanics and First aid will also be imparted.

Karnataka State Forest Academy, Gungargatti, Dharwad

The erstwhile Forest Training Institute, Gungaragatti, Dharwad, established in 1996, has been upgraded to Karnataka State Forest Academy (KSFA), Dharwad. The construction of the Institute started in 1992 under World Bank aided social forestry project and was completed in 1996 under Western Ghats project. It was established as a Forest Training Institute in the year 1996 with the aim to provide in-service training to officers of Karnataka Forest Department and induction training to newly recruited staff. Located at a distance of 12 km from district head quarters Dharwad, the campus is spread over an area of 42.16 ha.

In January 2015, Government of India approved the proposal for setting up RFO Academy at FTI, Gungargatti, Dharwad and it was upgraded to the status of Forest Academy and renamed Karnataka State Forest Academy,

Dharwad and received accreditation and recognition by the DFE as one of the Training Institutions in the country for imparting forestry training to Range Officers.

Kundal Academy of Development, Administration and Management (KADAM) (Forests), Kundal (Maharashtra)

KADAM (Forests) was established by the Government of Maharashtra in 2012, by upgrading the status of the erstwhile 'Forestry Training School' to 'Kundal Academy of Administration, Development and Management (Forests).

This Academy caters to the training needs of Range Forest Officers, Assistant Conservators of Forest and other senior level officers from within and outside the State. The Academy has been declared as a 'District Level Training Institute' under State Training Policy of Maharashtra. The Academy will provide mandatory training under State Training Policy Evaluation Agency (STPEA), which comprises of Foundation Training, Refresher Courses, Post-Promotional Courses, and Orientation Courses. A special feature of the Academy is to provide exposure and training of parasailing, paragliding, rappelling, rock-

climbing, skiing and various field management exercises.

Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul

Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul has been established in the year 1979 to impart training to the newly recruited Forest Ranger of Odisha and other state like Bihar, MP, J&K, Andaman and Nicobar Island, Assam, Mizoram, Arunachala Pradesh and Nagaland.

Proximity of Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul to Satkosia wildlife sanctuary and deep forest of Angul, Athmallik and Dhenkanal divisions of Odisha within 40-50 km are helpful in imparting classroom training and field exposure simultaneously. The state run college is controlled by the Director, Forest Education, Dehradun in respect of all matters related to the course of studies and imparting training to the trainees.

Forester training has been conducted from year 1964-65. From 1964-65 till 2016-17 1360 no. of foresters have been trained. Training of forester in Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul is conducted as per rules for Foresters Training in Odisha. The course duration of the newly recruited foresters is one year and for the promoted foresters it is four months.

Forest Guard Training started from 1957-58. From 1957-58 till 2016-17, total 7803 no. of

Forest Guard have been trained. Training of forester in Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul is conducted as per rules for Forest Guard Training in Odisha.

Besides the regular induction training of the forest guard and foresters the College was also providing Refresher Course to the frontline staff (Ranger, Dy. Ranger, Forester and Forest Guard) on the topics approved by DFE, Dehradun and on Computer application to the Ministerial staff since 2005 and of now 172 no. of Refresher courses have been conducted.

Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, Coimbatore

Tamil Nadu Forest Academy was started by the then Government of Madras Presidency as the Madras Forest College in the year 1912. F. A. Lodge, who was the Conservator of Forests in Coimbatore, was responsible for the establishment of this college at Coimbatore. It was the second Forest Rangers College to be established in India, after Dehradun. It was set upto meet the rising demand for trained Foresters in the country, especially those from the South India. F.L.C. Cowley Brown was its first Principal.

The College functioned from the municipal hospital building initially. An extent of 165

acres of land in the present R.S. Puram was acquired for constructing a new building for the college. The foundation of the new college building was laid by His Excellency Lord Pentland, then Governor of Madras, on 9th April, 1913. His Excellency was kind enough to inaugurate the majestic building subsequently on 14th October, 1915. The college building with its superior quality red-brick finish, represents an elegant Indo-saracenic architecture and is a prominent land mark in Coimbatore city.

Many distinguished Foresters have contributed to the development of the College right from its inception. F.L.C. Cowley Brown, served as Principal on two occasions, from 1912 to 1915 and again from 1917 to 1920. Eight distinguished British Foresters served as the Principals of this College from 1912 to 1939 including Mr. C.E.C. Fischer, an eminent Botanist. During the Second World War, the Madras Forest College was closed down and the campus was converted into an evacuee camp from 1939 to 1944. Evacuees from Burmah and Malta were housed here during that period. The college was again revived in 1945 with the illustrious Forest Officer C.R. Ranganathan as its first Indian Principal. It was taken over by Government of India in 1948 to train more number of Forest Ranger Trainees as the demand for trained Range officers increased in the Independent India.

In 1980 State Forest Service College was established in the same campus to train Assistant Conservator of Forests from all over India. It is now renamed as Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS). The SFRC was taken over by the Government of Tamil Nadu in 1990 and Thiru V.R. Chitrapu took over as its principal from B.R. Bhaskar. The SFRC was upgraded as 'Tamil Nadu Forest

Academy' (TNFA) in the year 2005. The TNFA continues to uphold the high standards of Forestry training set by the legendary foresters of the past even today. TNFA has trained 5074 Forest Rangers and 1282 Foresters since its inception in 1912. It is also offers short term refresher course to IFS officers/Assistant Conservators of Forests/ Forest Range Officers / Foresters and Ministerial staff on going schemes implemented by the Department from time to time.

The Tamil Nadu Forest Academy is maintaining the rich tradition and values left by the visionary Foresters of the yester age over the last 100 years. The year 2012 marks the Centenary of the TNFA. To mark this momentous occasion, the Centenary celebrations were held in the first week of July-2012.

Tamil Nadu Forest Academy has gone through several ups and down in its long history. It will continue to strive towards excellence in teaching forestry to its trainees through innovative teaching methods and modern tools. Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, Coimbatore has completed training to nearly 3000 officers and staff on Project orientation, Basic computer knowledge and Managerial training under TBGP since Feb. 2012 to till date.

Tamil Nadu Forest Academy consists of following training facilities:

- Four regular classrooms to accommodate 50–60 trainees in each classroom.
- Two modern air-conditioned conference hall that can accommodate 30-50 participants. The Conference halls are well equipped with all modern training amenities like Computer system with Multimedia Projectors, Video/ Audio systems and Conference facilities.

- A larger air-conditioned auditorium.
- A GIS lab with 50 Computers and relevant accessories to learn about computer application and the GIS and its application in Forestry.

Faculty Members:

- One Post in the rank of Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Director.
- One post in the rank of Conservator of Forests and Additional Director.
- One post in the rank of Deputy Conservator of Forests and Deputy Director.
- One post in the rank of Assistant Conservator of Forests.
- Four posts in the rank of Forest Range Officer.
- Two posts in the rank of Foresters.
- One post in the rank of Forest Guard.

Telangana State Forest Academy, Hyderabad

The training institution was done during the year 1926 at Nizamabad with objective to train Forest Guards. Subsequently it was shifted to Mahabubabad during the year 1928. It was upgraded with capacity to train Foresters during the year 1930. The training centre was again shifted to Yellendu during the year 1949 by developing the infrastructure and

it was started catering to the training needs of Andhra region also.

However, during the year 1987 a State Institute of Forestry Training (SIFT) was established at Dulapally with an objective to give training to the field staff to enhance the skills commensurate with the changing technology and methods. It was renamed as AP Forest Academy during the year 2001 and the Foresters' training was shifted from Forest School Yellendu.

The AP Forest Academy has been catering to the training needs of both newly recruited (induction) and in service staff (refresher) of forest department. The Forest Guards (FG) training was also shifted to APFA during the year 2006 with a view to provide better training facilities and academic inputs through renowned resource persons. During the year 2014, after bifurcation of erstwhile Andhra Pradesh state, and formation of Telangana state, the Academy is renamed as Telangana State Forest Academy (TSFA).

Uttarakhand Forestry Training Academy (UFTA), Haldwani (Uttarakhand)

UFTA was established in 1978 as a part of Uttar Pradesh Forest Department. It is one of the premier Institutions under Uttarakhand Forest Department, with a distinction of imparting wide array of training to wide spectrum of candidates.

Since its inception, UFTA has accomplished milestones of enormous magnitude and is ranked amongst the top Forestry Training Institutes of India. Under the administration and management of Uttarakhand Forest Department, the UFTA imparts induction training to Range Officers, Foresters and Forest

Guards. It also offers quarterly courses to frontline staff and Forest corporation employees. It is ideally located at Haldwani, district Nainital (Uttarakhand) which has train and bus connectivity to other parts of country.

The administration of the academy is headed by an officer of the Indian Forest Services (IFS), of the rank of Chief Conservator of Forests (CCF). one Additional Director(CF), number of Deputy Directors, both from Indian Forest Services as well as Provincial Forest Service, and Assistant Directors and Forest Range Officers serve under him for the smooth functioning of administrative as well as academic works of the academy.

The institute has outstanding and sprawling infrastructure with large administrative and academic block, guest houses, and hostels for boys and girls trainees, mess, library, playground, interpretation centre, gymnasium and auditorium etc. The library of UFTA has possessed big asset with an extensive collection of books. The UFTA administration ensures the availability of high and sophisticated gadgets for the training purpose so that the students are accustomed to prevalent use of technologies in their fields.

he primary focus of the Directorate is L the two year Induction Training for the newly recruited SFS Officers. The syllabi includes class room sessions, practical, field exercises, qualifying modules, case study tours, extensive tours and a four month On Job Training (OJT) segment. The training includes a first phase of training for 16 months in the Academy followed by a four month long OJT in the respective States and lastly the advanced phase for four months back at the Academy. During their stay at the Academy, the trainees also undergo rigorous physical endurance training and are exposed to various cultural, literary and social service activities for their all round personality development.

2016-2018 SFS Course: A new batch of SFS Induction Course comprising of 21 Officers Trainees (OTs) newly recruited from Gujarat, Maharashtra and Nagaland joined the Central Academy.

Field Training / On Job Training: The Officers Trainees of 2016-18 batch from Gujarat State has completed Field Training *i.e.* On the Job Training (OJT) w.e.f 15.06.2017 to 16.10.2017 and Officer Trainees from Maharashtra and Nagaland State has completed their OJT w.e.f. 14.07.2017 to 16.11.2017 for four months *i.e.* 16 weeks after completion of phase-I of professional training at Academy spending over sixteen months as per the Entrance and Training Rules (Revised) 2004.

Field exercises during this phase were as follows:



General Refresher Course

The General Refresher Course is designed in a way to refresh the professional skills of the in-service officers and also to help them keep abreast of the sector at all levels, including regional, national and international issue e.g. Protected Area management, bio-diversity conservation, global warming etc. in forestry and related disciplines. This one week course is generally recommended for promoted officers of SFS/FRO cadres.

Legal Issues in Forestry and Wildlife

The ever increasing population is bringing pressure on space and resources of mega cities. The smaller towns have also started feeling the pinch. The forest, its resources and wildlife are no exception to this phenomenon. Often, violation of various provisions of Acts, Rules and Regulations governing forest, protected areas, wildlife, etc. are seen and they are showing an increasing trend. Apart from prevention and early detection of various forest and wildlife offences, it is also imperative to achieve the maximum penalty on the offenders. Ultimately, effective prosecution of offenses in present and as in the past, is the biggest deterrent for future offenders. This scenario is throwing open a challenge before the personnel manning the forests and wildlife to upgrade and update their legal knowledge and acumen. These aspects including knowledge, skills and right interpretation of extant Acts, Rules and Procedures have been kept in view while preparing this course.

Training of Trainers

There is an ever-emerging challenge of capacity building of the trainers who join the State Forest Training Institutes from organization postings. It is proposed to respond to this need of Training of Trainers with a systematic approach to training which has been spearheaded by the Department of Personnel and Training of the Government of India, for more than two decades now.

The success of training depends upon identification of training needs to make it demand-driven, scientifically design suitable demands of change, deliver effectively with learner centered approach and monitor/ evaluate for further value addition. In addition mentoring and facilitation has become an integral part of functioning. All these aspects and latest trends in training have been kept in view while preparing this course.

Human Resource Management

For achieving effective management of the forest resources one of the important issues to be analyzed is existing human resource capabilities and how to build upon them. The performance in Forest Departments of the States depends on the collective contributions of all the officers/officials. The approach for

capacity building of the forestry personnel for protection, conservation and sustainable management of forest resources, using appropriate technology at the same time developing an attitude of working with the stakeholders, is required to be institutionalized. It involves judicious use of authority and keeping the workforce motivated for the effective management of resources.

Wildlife Management

The ever increasing human population is mounting pressure on natural resources including forest and wildlife since long. It is of paramount importance to conserve and sustain the wildlife for the existence of mankind. Though it is very difficult to envisage coexistence of man and animal in present socioeconomic human controlled environment, but the exclusive domain of wildlife can be maintained in these natural ecosystems.

Community Forestry and Joint Forest Management


The importance of the social dimension of forestry in today's world need not be overtly emphasized. With human population exploding across the globe, the pressure on forests for meeting the needs of fuel wood, fodder, timber has proportionately expanded. The stresses on natural ecosystems due to anthropogenic pressure have assumed dimensions of war not struggle for survival for the natural ecosystems and its myriad inhabitants. A recognition of the human dimension of forestry led to the implementation of Social and community forestry programmes in the 1970s and 80s. A further recognition of the people's rights on forests and their role in forestry came in the form of Joint Forest Management (JFM) resolution in 1991.

Training of Frontline Staff at SFTIs

The Government of India supplements the efforts of State Governments for capacity building of the Frontline Forest Staff (Deputy

Rangers/Foresters/Forest Guards) by providing funds to organize short-term training courses of two weeks duration each, for a group of 25-30 participants of the concerned State Forest Department where the course is organized. The

State Forest Department provides the infrastructure facilities (e.g. lecture hall, hostel accommodation etc.) and the resource persons to organize these courses. The total duration of the course should be for 12 days (4 sessions/

day), out of which 3 days may be devoted to field tours/excursions exercise. A total of ₹ 42,00,000/- was provided as assistance to various States for conduct of 40 courses benefitting 760 frontline Staff of 12 States.



CASFOS, Coimbatore

Swachhta Abhiyan was observed on 2nd October, 2017 and the Office premises, hostel premises and the campus have been cleaned voluntarily by the Trainees, Officers and Staff. The Academy has followed the guidelines of Government with respect to Cleanliness Drive. The faculty, staff and officer trainees are participating every week to clean the forest campus and also they are keeping the office premises, hostel premises and residential quarters clean and free from non-degradable plastic wastes. The organic domestic wastes are being used for preparation of organic manure in traditional pits. The plastic wastes are handed over to Coimbatore Municipal Corporation for recycling/proper disposal. The tree planting has also been done in available space through shramadan periodically during 2017-18.

CASFOS, Dehradun

The Academy has identified and adopted a multipronged strategy to achieve its vision of transforming itself into a carbon neutral campus. Salient features of this strategy are as below:-

- i. Reduce plastic and other non-degradable consumables:
 - a) Identification of waste generation sources and segregation into bio-

- degradable and non-biodegradable at source itself.
- b) Complete ban on the use of plastic disposable cups, plates, glasses, mineral water bottles etc. for trainings and other official programmes.
- c) Switching to hand painted cloth banners instead of banners, boards and standees made of flex.
- d) Switching back to traditional ways of welcoming and honouring dignitaries through coconut and khadi shawl, gifting plants in small hand painted pots and books instead of bouquets wrapped in polythene sheets and metal wires.
- e) Distributing / gifting jute or cloth bags to visiting dignitaries and participants of training programmes.
- f) We switched to e- office platform as a step towards a 'less paper' office.

ii. Reuse and recycle of various materials:-

- a) Milk poly bags from officers' mess are regularly shifted to nursery for growing plants.
- b) Old curtains, bed sheets and table cloths have been converted and reuse as seat covers, aprons for mess staff and cloth bags for wider distribution.
- c) The paper waste generated in the campus is to be recycled into files and file folders through tie-up with Hast Nirmit Kagaz Udhyog Sahkari Samiti Ltd.

iii. Clean and efficient energy use practices:-

- a) Phasing out of CFL and replacing by LED lighting in phased manner.
- b) Use of parabolic solar cooker in the officers mess to reduce LPG consumption.

c) Initiated steps for switching to solar energy to meet 100% energy requirement of the academy in the near future.

iv. Managing organic waste:-

- a) Managing organic waste generated in the campus through innovative City Farming technique.
- b) Adopting high speed composting method using patented bio-culture Vermi 3G for utilizing leaf litter and garden waste.

waste management strategy of CASFOS, Dehradun is based on the following principles:

- 1) Any waste management strategy begins with identification of the point sources from where waste is generated. Detailed survey in the campus identified four point sources.
- 2) At each point source segregation of waste was carried out into biodegradable and non-biodegradable.

From September 2016 to April 2018, a whopping 6.63 tonnes of organic waste has been managed through City Farming in CASFOS Dehradun through 37 drums installed in the campus. These drums support 481 perennial plants. Each drum is thus a micro-habitat comprising of plants that attract butterflies, bees, insects, birds and other organisms. 644 people has been trained on city farming by this academy.



EVALUATION AND REVIEW SYSTEM

There will be two layers of review of the contributions; Faculty and the Directorate review. Evaluation and review at the faculty level in the training institutes/academies will be undertaken under the guidance of Director/Principal/Head of the institutions. Even very specialized and technical topics shall be presented in simplified format so that frontline staff and forest community are able to appreciate and understand the topics. Articles shall be written in a popular style, easily understandable and in simple English.

However depending on the response to this programme, arrangements can be made for translation of the magazine into the vernacular. A short note about the contributor and the reviewer shall accompany the article. The note shall contain name, age, postal and e-mail address, course, academic accomplishments, and important assignments held. The evaluation would be done on following criteria:

- **a. Style:** The article should be interesting and informative. The introduction should draw the reader in and convince them that the remainder is worth reading. The remaining should be written in a lively and concise style, and should leave the reader convinced of the importance of the topic.
- **b. Structure:** The article should be within 1000 words, and formatted in 1.5 line spacing in Times New Roman 12 point font.

c. Organization:

- Instead of an abstract the article will give information on the location, the period when the field work was carried out.
- Integration the article organized in a coherent form and all ideas are clearly leading to a single main argument.

The review at the Directorate level will be done through an editorial board constituted by the DFE, which will be responsible for the content, design and review of the journal articles. The editorial board shall consist of expert/experts constituted by DFE and reconstituted every year, which would screen contributions and recommend their publication. Articles previously published elsewhere, or simultaneously sent for publication elsewhere, may be accepted with modifications. Article submitted shall carry a declaration that the article is original. The Editor would reserve the right to reject articles without assigning any reason and articles not found suitable will be sent back.
