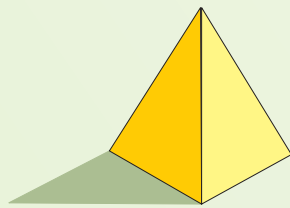

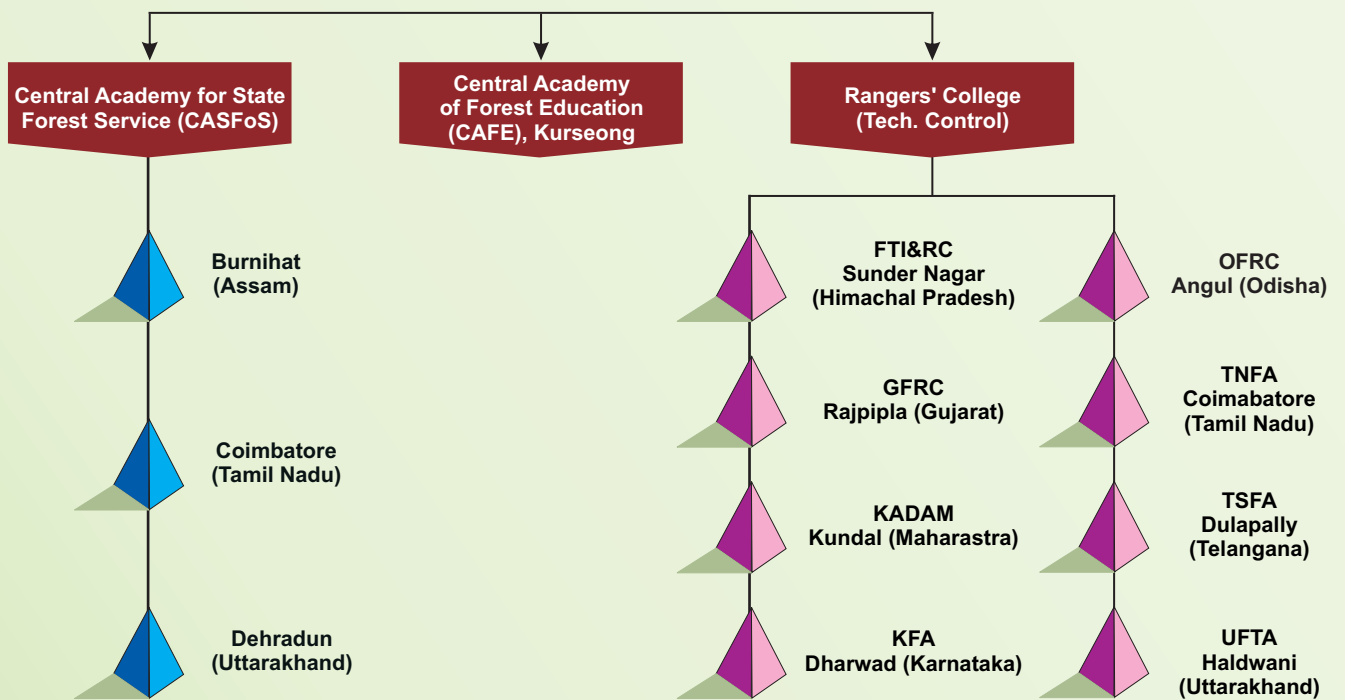

This Directorate has got such courses organised in almost every state of the country and there has been wide spread appreciation of the same.

The Director's Report - 2020 of the DFE is a compilation of all the activities of the Directorate and its constituent Academies during the year 2019-2020.

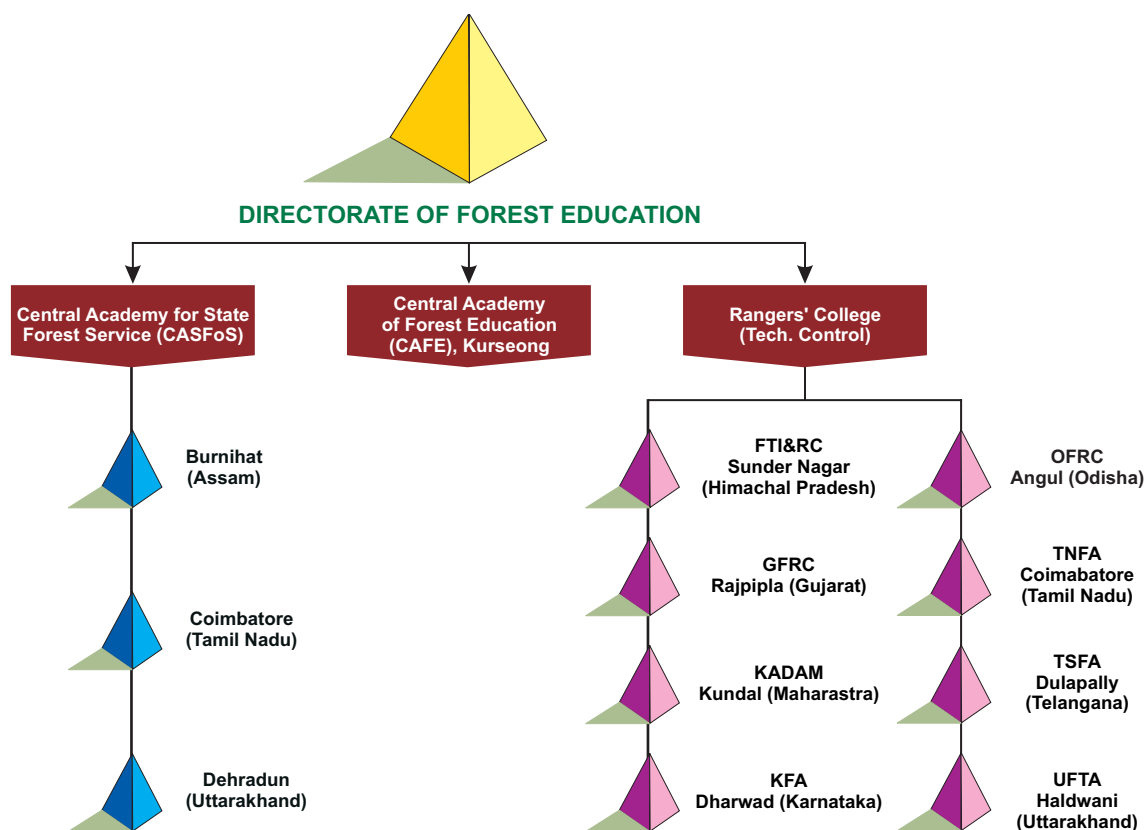
Directorate of Forest Education

The post of Director Forest Education was created in the year 1953 to assist the President, Forest Research Institute and Colleges and was responsible for professional and technical training/education in the country. Subsequent to re-organization of Forestry Research, Education and Training Institutions in 1987, the erstwhile Indian Forest College got upgraded to Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy. Indian Council of

Forestry Research and Education was created as an autonomous body under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) to organize, direct and manage research in Forest Sector at national level.

The Directorate of Forest Education was separated as an independent organization under the direct control of MoEF&CC for the training of State Forest Service officers

and Forest Range Officers. The Directorate also supplements the efforts of the State Governments for the training of Frontline Forest Staff (Deputy Rangers, Foresters and Forest Guards).

The main mandate of the Directorate of Forest Education are:

- To cater to the training needs of the SFS Officers and RFOs of States/Union Territories in the country.
- To ensure 'Standard and Quality' of Training being imparted to the Forestry personnel other than Indian Forest Service.
- To augment training 'Capacity and Facility' for the Frontline Forest Staff (Forest Guards, Foresters, Deputy Rangers and Range Officers).
- To assist in developing appropriate and relevant training contents and evaluation standards for forestry training at all levels below IFS.
- To help States assess training needs of forestry personnel.
- To assist in the development of training policy for forestry personnel.

Presently the Directorate directly controls three Central Academies for State Forest Service, at Dehradun (Uttarakhand), Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) and Burnihat (Assam) and one Central Academy of Forest Education (CAFE) at Kurseong (West Bengal).

The Directorate also exercises, technical control over all the State run Rangers Colleges in the country. All these Academies/Colleges/Institutes/Schools undertake the activities concerning induction and in-service training of SFS Officers and FROs and short term General Refresher Courses, Theme Based Courses of two week duration, One week workshop for in-service SFS Officers and FROs as per their respective mandate.

The Directorate of Forest Education is headed by the Director Forest Education; a senior officer from the

Indian Forest Service. The Directorate has had illustrious members of the service heading it over a period of eight decades.

Institutions under the Directorate

Following the re-organization of Forest Research Institute and Colleges and creation of Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) as an autonomous organization, the Directorate of Forest Education was de-linked from the Forest Research Institute and Colleges. It has since then functioned directly under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

To cater to the increasing demand of the State Forest Departments and Central forestry organization for trained Officers, three State Forest Service Colleges were established by the Central Government at Burnihat (Assam) in 1976, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) in 1980 and Dehradun (Uttarakhand) in 1981 for imparting training to the State Forest Service Officers of two years duration.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFoS), Burnihat

Established in the year 1976, CASFoS, Burnihat has the distinction of being the first Academy for SFS / ACF officers in the country. The Academy is spread in an area of about 23 hectares with offices and most infrastructure facilities located in the Assam side of campus. However,

NH 40 divides the Academy premises into two with residential quarters for staff and officers located in the Meghalaya side. This Academy had provided induction training to 531 ACF/SFS officers in 16 batches. The Academy started training FROs from the year 2000 and since then 453 Range Officers in 17 batches have passed out from this Academy as on date.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFoS), Coimbatore

Established in 1980, CASFoS, Coimbatore is located in the picturesque Forest Campus at R.S. Puram in the city of Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu. The Academy is spread in an area of about 20 hectares situated at a distance of 5 km from the Coimbatore Railway Station and 22 km from Coimbatore International Airport. The Academy shares the space of the exquisite Forest Campus alongwith two more premier forestry institutions viz., Tamil Nadu Forest Academy (TNFA) and Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB), one of the leading research institutes under Indian Council of Forest Research and Education. This campus also houses the famous 'Gass Museum'.

Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and National History (SACON) is another neighboring institution situated at a distance of 25 kms.

The Academy imparts professional Induction training to newly recruited State Forest Officers (ACF) and Forest Range Officers (FRO) from various states, and offers in-service training to the State Forest Service Officers of DCF, ACF, FRO and Deputy FRO ranks.

This Academy had provided induction training to 796 ACF/SFS officers in 24 batches. The Academy started training for FROs from the year 2000 and since then 369 Range Officers in 13 batches have passed out from this Academy as on date.

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFoS), Dehradun

Established in 1981, the CASFoS, Dehradun is located in the beautiful New Forest Campus in Dehradun which is also the cradle of Forestry Education and Training in India. The Academy is spread in an area of about 16 hectares. CASFoS has the privilege of having in its neighbourhood other premier institutions like Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy (IGNFA), Indian Council for Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Forest Research Institute (FRI), FRI University, Forest Survey of India (FSI) and Wildlife Institute of India (WII) which enhance the learning environment for the Officer Trainees with

increased opportunities for interaction with serving IFS Officers, Probationers from IGNFA, Scientists and Researchers from ICFRE and FRI.

This Academy had provided induction training to 1159 ACF/SFS officers in 33 batches have passed out from this Academy as on date.

Central Academy of Forest Education (CAFE), Kurseong

Established in 1974, the CAFE is the only forest training institution under Government of India exclusively to train Forest Range Officers. The Academy is housed in a huge colonial period building and situated on picturesque Saint Mary's Hill in Kurseong sub-division of Darjeeling district, West Bengal. The College building has three storey with basement and attic. The floor area of the building is 0.55 hectare. The building has 121 rooms which houses office, Principal's and Faculty chambers, Classrooms, Conference room, Engineering hall, Library, Hostel, Mess, Kitchen, Bathrooms etc. The land area of the institute is about 12 hectares, in which two nos. type-IV quarters, two nos. type – III quarters, one glass house, one football ground, one basketball court, one tennis court are also present besides the main College building.

This Academy had provided induction training to 1621 Forest Range Officers in 28 batches has been passed out from this Academy as on date.

Accredited Institutions

Forest Training Institute and Rangers College (FTI&RC), Sunder Nagar, Himachal Pradesh

Forestry Training Institute and Rangers College (FTI & RC), Sundernagar, Himachal Pradesh conducts Induction training of Forest Guards and Range Forest Officers and refresher courses to in-service Forest Personnel. The institute started training Forest Guards in 1993 and since then 31 batches of Forest Guards have passed out. Similarly, in the year 2012, the institute was empanelled for conducting 18 months certificate course for Range Forest Officers through DFE, Dehradun and 4 batches comprising of 135 RFOs have passed out. Besides the regular training courses, tailor made refresher training courses on Forestry and Wildlife related subjects for serving Forest Front-line Staff, Ministerial Staff and Officers of different rank are conducted.

FTI&RC, Sundernagar is situated at an altitude of 1000 meters above the mean sea level near Van Chetana Kendra DPF Trambari Karnody. It covers an area of 1.2 ha and is about 6 kms from Sundernagar bus stand on National Highway-21 (Chandigarh-Manali Highway).

Gujarat Forest Rangers College (GFRC), Rajpipla, Gujarat

Gujarat Forest Rangers College has been established in 1979 with as objective of Training Range Forest Officers from different states of the country. This college is in a campus known as Vadia Palace presently in Rajpipla Ta. Nandod, Dist. Narmada, Gujarat. The palace was built by the then King of Rajpipla Late Shri Vijaysinhji Gohil. After Independence, this property was sold to Government of Bombay, which subsequently became Government of Gujarat after 1960. The total area of Vadia Palace is around 64.08 ha out which the GFRC occupies the area of 56.08 ha and 8.00 ha is occupied by government Ayurvedic pharmacy.

The First batch of Range Forest officer trainees underwent the basic training during 1979-81 with strength

of 31 trainees and in subsequent batches 564 Range Forest Officers took training in 17 different batches. The college has trained Officer Trainees from a total of 12 states and 1 UT. The alumni of this college are spread over Uttar Pradesh, Nagaland, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Jammu and Kashmir, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and U.T. of Diu and Daman and Dadra Nagar Haveli.

The college also has imparted training to 341 Vanpal Sahayak (Assistant Forester) and 465 Vanraksha Sahayak (Guard Assistant) so far. The college also conducted short and long term courses, and front line staff training. The college has also conducted periodical trainings for surveyors, clerks and accountants of the Department.

The college also has different facilities in form of Classrooms, Conference room, Library, Computer lab, Sports ground, Hostel and Guesthouse. The college is also having facility of Virtual Class rooms through Video conferencing for connecting with experts in different fields to interact with trainees on various occasions. Training in the field of Weapons, Motor Mechanics, and First aid have also been imparted.

Faculties for training have been selected from among serving and retired senior Forest Officers as well as from selected institutions such as MS University, Baroda and Navsari Agriculture University etc. Few other institutes / departments have also been involved like Coast Guard, Special Task Force of Tamil Nadu Police, Gujarat Police, WII, etc with intent to provide quality inputs to the trainees.

Karnataka State Forest Academy (KSFA), Gungargatti, Dharwad

The erstwhile Forest Training Institute, Gungaragatti, Dharwad, established in 1996, has been upgraded to Karnataka State Forest Academy (KSFA), Dharwad. The construction of the Institute started in 1992 under World Bank aided social forestry project and was completed in

1996 under Western Ghats project. It was established as a Forest Training Institute in the year 1996 with the aim to provide in-service training to officers of Karnataka Forest Department and induction training to newly recruited staff. Located at a distance of 12 km from district head quarters Dharwad, the campus is spread over an area of 42.16 ha.

In January 2015, Government of India approved the proposal for setting up RFO Academy at FTI, Gungargatti, Dharwad and it was upgraded to the status of Forest Academy and renamed Karnataka State Forest Academy, Dharwad and received accreditation and recognition by the DFE as one of the Training Institutions in the country for imparting forestry training to Range Officers.

Kundal Academy of Development, Administration and Management (KADAM), (Forests), Kundal, Maharashtra

KADAM (Forests), Kundal, Maharashtra is one of the premiere institute in the country which imparts the training various cadres of the Forest Department and other Government Departments. Initially it was started as Forest Training Institute on 15th August 2013 vide Government of Maharashtra. Revenue and Forest Department Government Resolution dated 24/06/2011.

The academy was given autonomous status by the Government of Maharashtra Revenue Forest Department Resolution dated 07/02/2014. The State Forestry Training

Society is formed and which is registered under Mumbai charitable trust Act 1950 and Society Act. 1860.

The Academy has Administration Building, Training Institute, Mess & Gym Building, Executive Hostel, Boys Hostel and Ladies Hostel. The academy has eight classrooms which has the seating capacity of 552 and 3 computer labs with 136 capacity. There are six hostels in which 300 trainees can be accommodated. Recently the grants for construction of separate Executive hostel with 175 capacity was received and the work is in progress.

The academy is well equipped with Cardiac Gym, regular exercises Gym and separate Ladies gym. There is good playing facilities like Badminton Court, Snooker, Table tennis, Lawn tennis court. 50 bicycles are made available for the trainees which acts as a source of recreation and exercise for all the trainees trained here.

The campus is well protected and security is maintained by Maharashtra Ex. Servicemen corporation Ltd. (MESCO). The lush green garden lawns Sahyadri biological Park, Bamboo setum, Miyawaki plantations are some of the landmarks that glorify the campus.

The separate visiting medical officer is available in the academy for routine medical check-up of the trainees.

Odisha Forest Rangers College (OFRC), Angul

Odisha Forest Rangers College, Angul has been

established in the year 1979 in Angul district of Odisha to impart training to the newly recruited Forest Ranger of Odisha and other states like Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Andaman and Nicobar Island, Assam, Mizoram, Arunachala Pradesh and Nagaland. This is the premier Forest Training institute situated in the heart of Odisha proximity to deep forests, wildlife sanctuaries and a tiger reserve which helps to impart classroom training and exposure visits simultaneously to the trainees. The state run college is controlled by the Director Forest Education, Dehradun in respect of all matters related to the course of studies and imparting training to the trainees. Total 430 Forest Ranger Trainees have been trained in 15 (fifteen) batches from this institution from 1979 till 1994-96. From 1996 to 2017 no Forest Rangers Training course has been conducted. But during March, 2018 permission was accorded by Director Forest Education, Dehradun for conducting Induction training of 111 nos. FRO Trainees of Odisha State.

Tamil Nadu Forest Academy (TNFA), Coimbatore

Having evolved from the erstwhile Madras Forest College at Coimbatore which has a hoary past and history of over 108 years, the Tamil Nadu Forest Academy has grown and reckoned as one of the premier institutions of

the country conducting In-service and Induction Training for Forest Personnel from Forest Watchers to IFS Officers; Over the last 10 years of its existence, the Academy has moulded and equipped many batches of forest officials with professional knowledge and skills required for them to discharge their duties as professional foresters.

Since inception, this institution has trained about 54 ACF's, 5294 Range Forest Officers, 1587 Foresters, and 593 Forest Guards under regular Induction trainings and more than 5000 Forest Personnel including ministerial staff under various theme -based trainings.

Telangana State Forest Academy (TSFA), Hyderabad

The training institution was established in 1926 at Nizamabad with an objective to train Forest Guards. Subsequently, it was shifted to Mahabubabad during the year 1928. It was upgraded with capacity to train Foresters during the year 1930. The training centre was again shifted to Yellendu during the year 1949 by developing the infrastructure and it was started catering to the training needs of Andhra region also.

However, during the year 1987 a State Institute of Forestry Training (SIFT) was established at Dulapally with an objective to give training to the field staff to enhance the skills commensurate with the changing technology and methods. It was renamed as AP Forest Academy

during the year 2001 and the Foresters' training was shifted from Forest School Yellendu.

The AP Forest Academy has been catering to the training needs of both newly recruited (induction) and in service staff (refresher) of forest department. The Forest Guards (FG) training was also shifted to APFA during the year 2006 with a view to provide better training facilities and academic inputs through renowned resource persons. During the year 2014, after bifurcation of erstwhile Andhra Pradesh state, and formation of Telangana state, the Academy is renamed as Telangana State Forest Academy (TSFA).

Uttarakhand Forestry Training Academy (UFTA), Haldwani, Uttarakhand

UFTA, Haldwani is one of the premier Institutions under Uttarakhand Forest Department, with a distinction of imparting wide array of training to wide spectrum of candidates. It was established in 1978 as a part of Uttar Pradesh Forest Department.

Since its inception, UFTA has accomplished milestones of enormous magnitude and is ranked amongst the top Forestry Training Institutes of India. Under the administration and management of Uttarakhand Forest Department, the UFTA imparts induction training to Range Officers, Foresters and Forest Guards. It also offers

quarterly courses to frontline staff and Forest corporation employees. It is ideally located at Haldwani, District Nainital (Uttarakhand) which has train and bus connectivity to other parts of country.

The administration of the academy is headed by an officer of the Indian Forest Services (IFS), of the rank of Chief Conservator of Forests (CCF). one Additional Director(CF), few Deputy Directors, both from Indian Forest Services as well as Provincial Forest Service, and

Assistant Directors and Forest Range Officers serve under him for the smooth functioning of administrative as well as academic works of the academy. Apart from these, academy has some other faculty members for imparting training to the trainees. Team of clerical staff, Foresters and Forest Guards carry out other day to day activities of the academy.

The institute has outstanding and sprawling infrastructure with large administrative and academic block, guest houses, and hostels for boys and girl's trainees, mess, library, playground, interpretation centre, gymnasium and auditorium etc. The library of UFTA has possessed big asset with an extensive collection of books. The administrative and teaching staffs resides in the campus itself, offering student a robust and sound technical and academic support round the clock. The UFTA administration ensures the availability of high and sophisticated gadgets for the training purpose so that the students are accustomed to prevalent use of technologies in their fields.

CHAPTER

The primary focus of the Directorate is the two year Induction Training for the newly recruited SFS Officers. The syllabi includes class room sessions, practical, field exercises, qualifying modules, case study tours, extensive tours and a four month On Job Training (OJT). The training includes a first phase of training for 16 months in the Academy followed by a four month long OJT in the respective States and finally the advanced phase for four months back at the Academy. During their stay at the Academy, the trainees also undergo rigorous physical endurance training and are exposed to various cultural, literary and social service activities for their all round personality development.

CASFoS, Burnihat

2017-2019 SFS Batch: A batch with strength of 32 OTs

from Chhattisgarh, West Bengal and Gujarat completed training on 16th July, 2019.

2019-2021 SFS Batch: At present there are 37 SFS Officers undergoing 24 months training in this Academy from states of Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Tamilnadu, Chhattisgarh (FD) and Chhattisgarh (Corp.) whose training has commenced on 26th August, 2019.

In-service Trainings

General Refresher Course

The General Refresher Course is designed in a way to refresh the professional skills of the in-service officers and also to help them keep abreast of the sector at all levels, including regional, national and international issue e.g. Protected Area management, bio-diversity conservation, global warming etc. in forestry and related disciplines. This one week course is generally recommended for promoted officers of SFS/FRO cadres.

Legal Issues in Forestry and Wildlife

The ever increasing population is bringing pressure on space and resources of mega-cities. The smaller towns have also started feeling the pinch. The forest, its resources and wildlife are no exception to this phenomenon. Often, violation of various provisions of Acts, Rules and Regulations governing forest, protected areas, wildlife, etc. are seen and they are showing an increasing trend. Apart from prevention and early detection of various forest and wildlife offences, it is also imperative to achieve the maximum penalty on the offenders. Ultimately, effective prosecution of offenses in present and as in the past, is the biggest deterrent for future offenders. This scenario is throwing open a challenge before the personnel manning the forests and wildlife to upgrade and update their legal knowledge and acumen. These aspects including knowledge, skills and right interpretation of extant Acts, Rules and Procedures have been kept in view while preparing this course.

Training of Trainers

There is an ever-emerging challenge of capacity building of the trainers who join the State Forest Training Institutes from organization postings. It is proposed to

respond to this need of Training of Trainers with a systematic approach to training which has been spearheaded by the Department of Personnel and Training of the Government of India, for more than two decades now.

The success of training depends upon identification of training needs to make it demand-driven, scientifically design suitable demands of change, deliver effectively with learner centered approach and monitor/ evaluate for further value addition. In addition mentoring and facilitation has become an integral part of functioning. All these aspects and latest trends in training have been kept in view while preparing this course.

Human Resource Management

For achieving effective management of the forest resources one of the important issues to be analyzed is existing human resource capabilities and how to build upon them. The performance in Forest Departments of the States depends on the collective contributions of all the officers/officials. The approach for capacity building of the forestry personnel for protection, conservation and sustainable management of forest resources, using appropriate technology at the same time developing an attitude of working with the stakeholders, is required to be institutionalized. It involves judicious use of authority and keeping the workforce motivated for the effective management of resources.

Wildlife Management

The ever increasing human population is mounting pressure on natural resources including forest and wildlife since long. It is of paramount importance to conserve and sustain the wildlife for the existence of mankind. Though it



is very difficult to envisage co-existence of man and animal in present socio-economic human controlled environment, but the exclusive domain of wildlife can be maintained in these natural ecosystems.

Biodiversity Conservation for Sustainable Livelihood

The importance of the social dimension of forestry in today's world need not be overtly emphasized. With human population exploding across the globe, the pressure on forests for meeting the needs of fuel wood,

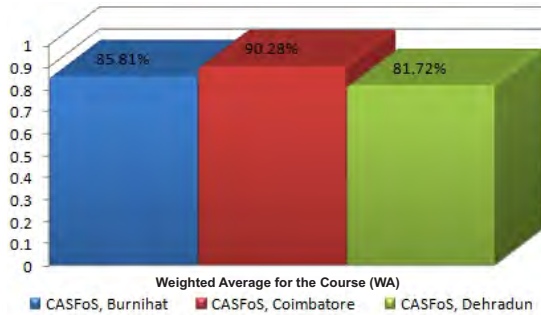
fodder, timber has proportionately expanded. The stresses on natural ecosystems due to anthropogenic pressure have assumed dimensions of war not struggle for survival for the natural ecosystems and its myriad inhabitants. A recognition of the human dimension of forestry led to the implementation of Social and community forestry programmes in the 1970s and 1980s. A further recognition of the people's rights on forests and their role in forestry came in the form of Joint Forest Management (JFM) resolution in 1991.

Training of Frontline Staff at SFTIs

The Government of India supplements the efforts of State Governments for capacity building of the Frontline Forest Staff (Deputy Rangers / Foresters / Forest Guards) by providing funds to organize short-term training courses of one week duration each, for a group of 25-30 participants of the concerned State Forest Department where the course is organized. The State Forest Department

provides the infrastructure facilities (e.g. lecture hall, hostel accommodation etc.) and the resource persons to organize these courses. The total duration of the course should be for 6 days (4 sessions / day), out of which 1 day may be devoted to field tours/excursions exercise. A total of ₹ 42,14,780/- was provided as assistance to various States for conduct of 29 courses benefitting 685 Frontline Staff of 12 States.

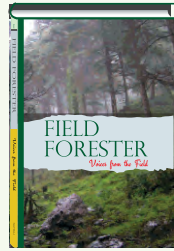

EVALUATION AND REVIEW SYSTEM

There will be two layers of review of the contributions; Faculty and the Directorate review. Evaluation and review at the faculty level in the training institutes/academies will be undertaken under the guidance of Director/Principal/Head of the institutions. Even very specialized and technical topics shall be presented in simplified format so that frontline staff and forest community are able to appreciate and understand the topics. Articles shall be written in a popular style, easily understandable and in simple English.

However depending on the response to this programme, arrangements can be made for translation of the magazine into the vernacular. A short note about the contributor and the reviewer shall accompany the article. The note shall contain name, age, postal and e-mail address, course, academic accomplishments, and important assignments held. The evaluation would be done on following criteria:

Style: The article should be interesting and informative. The introduction should draw the reader in and convince them that the remainder is worth reading. The remaining should be written in a lively and concise style, and should leave the reader convinced of the importance of the topic.

Structure: The article should be within 1000 words, and formatted in 1.5 line spacing in Times New Roman 12 point font.

Organization:

- Instead of an abstract the article will give information on the location, the period when the field work was carried out.
- Integration - the article organized in a coherent form and all ideas are clearly leading to a single main argument.

The review at the Directorate level will be done through an editorial board constituted by the DFE, which will be responsible for the content, design and review of the journal articles. The editorial board shall consist of expert/experts constituted by DFE and reconstituted every year, which would screen contributions and recommend their publication. Articles previously published elsewhere, or simultaneously sent for publication elsewhere, may be accepted with modifications. Article submitted shall carry a declaration that the article is original. The Editor would reserve the right to reject articles without assigning any reason and articles not found suitable will be sent back.
