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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS), Dehradun under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, took a step ahead of its mandate and conducted three days (from 21.02.2024 to 23.02.2024) training programme for “**NHAI, PWD / CPWD, Railways, Power Sector and other Engineering Department**” on the theme “**Green Infrastructure**”. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India sponsored for the ‘Training of other stakeholders’ and ‘Personnel of other services’ on topics/themes related to conservation of Forest & Natural Resources. The training was conducted in a physical mode.

The training was inaugurated by Chief Guest – Dr. V. B. Mathur, Ex-chairman, NBA & Former Director, WII, Dehradun in presence of Smt. Meenakshi Joshi, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Dehradun. In the opening remarks, Smt. Meenakshi Joshi, IFS stressed the need for such courses intended for other stakeholders and their importance in spreading awareness and carrying forward extension activities. She emphasized further on the link between the participants and the forest department in carrying forward the work of conservation. Chief Guest keynote speaker Dr. V. B. Mathur, Ex-chairman, NBA & Former Director, WII, Dehradun talked about various developmental activities presently underway in the country especially where forest is involved. The Chief Guest emphasized the importance of Green Infrastructure on present days as conservation of nature during the construction has to be kept in mind. He also urged the participants to use innovative & different ways to save forests for green growth inclusive of conservation. The detailed timetable showing session-wise topics and resource persons is enclosed as **Annexure-V**.

A total of 27 participants from 10 States across India registered for the training out of which 20 participants from 04 States successfully completed the training programme. The training programme was very well appreciated by the participants who also requested more of such training programmes regularly, for keeping up the momentum of conservation of natural resources through other stakeholder participation. The reduction in the number of participants when compared to the registered number was due to unavoidable reasons for some participants at the last moment.

Valedictory session was presided over by chief guest Mr. Anurag Bhardwaj, IFS, Director, Directorate Forest of Education, Dehradun during which an interactive session with the participants was also held. Feedback by the participants during the session was also highlighted by her for improving future programs. Sh. Amlendu Pathak, IFS, Course Director, gave a presentation about the program and concluded the program with a vote of thanks to the entire team and to the participants. The participants gave an overwhelming response to the course.

A compendium of articles, presentations related to the relevant topics covered during the course, apart from the copies of the presentations made by the experts in each session were provided in soft copy to each trainee as part of the training kit by the Academy.

The overall impact of the training was positive and the feedback and high rating from the participants corroborates the assessment of the organizers.



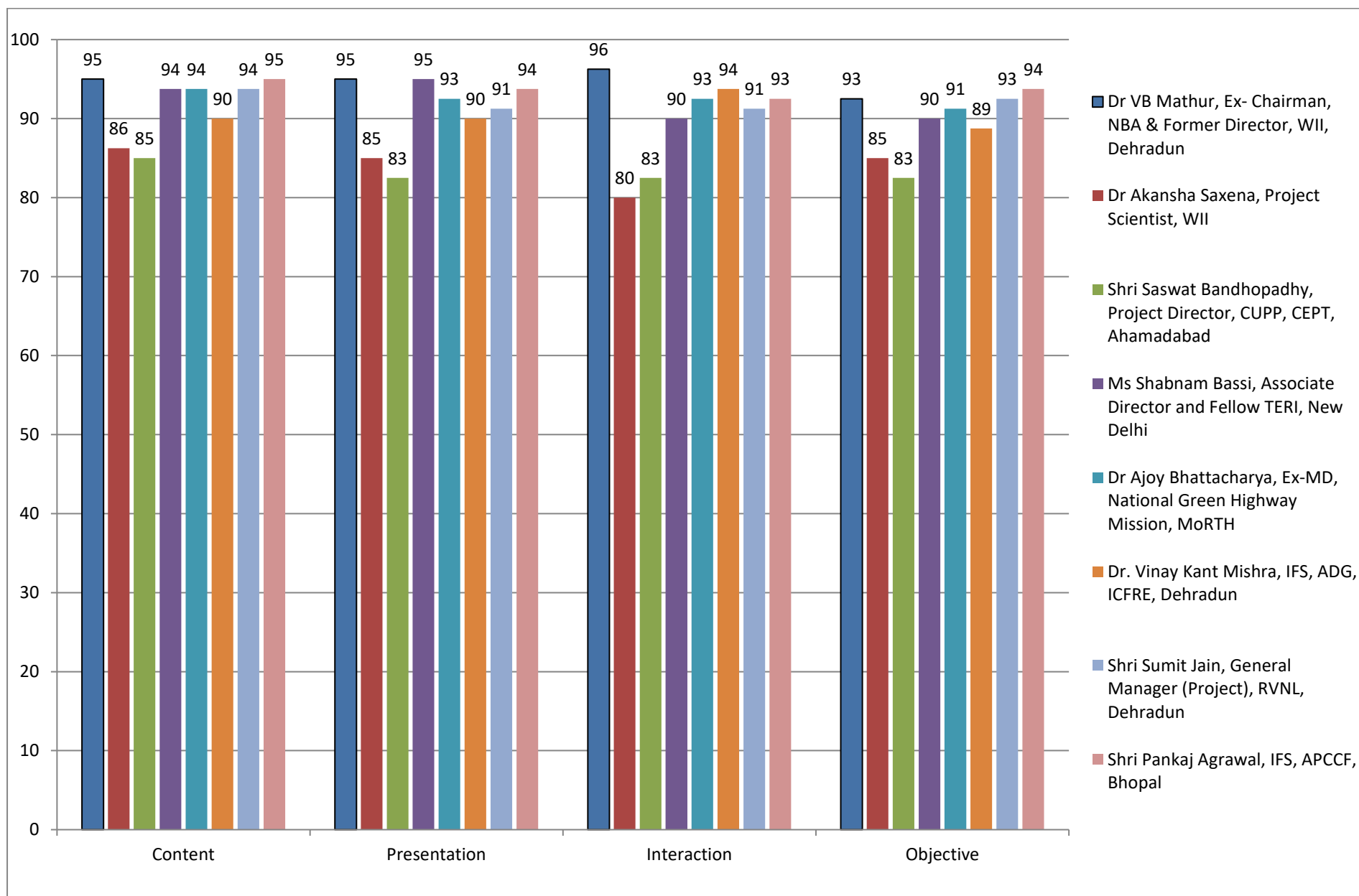
